<u>Points</u>	<u>Objective</u>
___/20	Share biographical essentials, including era, place and influences.
___/20	Define key terms, help to develop the class vocabulary in relation to your subject and build a better understanding of this school of thought.
___/50	Summarize and analyze seminal work related to ethics; read the critical passages and efficiently and effectively convey your understanding of the material, with an emphasis on helping your audience understand the material.
___/50	Establish the subject's role in the foundation of ethics theory / Compare to other ideas presented so far in this class (Oct. 9 reports should reflect on at least one Oct. 2 report; Oct. 16 and 23 reports should reflect on at least two of the previous presentations).
___/10	Work within desired time frame: No more than 15 minutes (no less than 10), plus a couple of minutes for questions, including one randomly generated question.
___/30	Create a lively and engaging presentation, with visual aides and specific contemporary examples of ideas. Memorize a majority of the presentation.
___/20	Be prepared as an authority on this subject, able to answer basic classmate / instructor questions.
