Making a source list

Please follow these directions:

1. Determine the scope of your topic, then research who else is writing and reporting as well as creating information about that. **Make a list of the top 15 important organizations / companies / individuals involved in discourse about this topic.**
2. Determine what your critical organizations and resources to watch will be. Pick what you think will be the **top five**, and generate a to-research list that includes the group's web page, its physical address, its contact information, a listing of its top administrators and other other information you can gather quickly, including why it makes your top five.
3. Determine who your critical sources will be. Pick what you think will be the **top five**, and generate a to-contact list that includes their full names, titles, phone numbers, e-mail addresses and what they do in relation to your topic, plus any other information you can quickly glean, including why each person made your top five.
4. Create a neat and orderly one page document, preferably in a spreadsheet, that lists this information. Turn that in on: **Jan. 23, 2008.**
